

There is no doubt that a good home protects a child from all kinds of dangers and is the best place for equipping them for all of life's challenges and responsibilities. That's not to say that they receive no help from the outside. School, church, and other organizations are very important for supporting and supplementing what the parents cannot do. But the family remains the most important.

This applies not only to a child's physical, mental, and emotional health, but also spiritual. This is often forgotten by families. During their hectic week of school, activities, and work, parents easily prioritize the seemingly most urgent needs over what is most necessary. The world fills our schedules with times and deadlines for everything but for Christian devotion. Thus, prayer, Scripture, and catechism are barely done. After all, no one is going to drop a grade or fail a class or miss a deadline by skipping prayer or reading the Bible.

On the other hand, there is a real deadline coming. "For as were the days of Noah, so will be the coming of the Son of Man" (Matthew 24:37). That is, just as the people of Noah's day were going about all their regular business unawares when the flood suddenly swept them away, so it will be on the day of judgment when Christ returns. Satan hasn't forgotten the deadline. He knows he has only so much time left to deceive us into sin before he is thrown into the lake of fire. Thus, he is at work on all Christian families, night and day, to trick us into false belief, despair, or some sinful vice. We have nothing to fear if we abide in Christ. For Christ has power over him and promises that He will not lose

those who are His own. But if we depart from His Word and Sacraments and cease to call upon Him, we will leave ourselves vulnerable to the devil's attacks.

Let us recommit ourselves to Christ's Word through not only church attendance, but also daily prayer and meditation. Use the Small Catechism to keep your children walking in God's Commandments, in prayer, and according to their faith expressed in the Creed. I should not have to be teaching children in 6th and 7th grade to memorize the Ten Commandments. They should already know them by heart, for they've had thirteen years or more to break them!

Especially today, when the mainstream culture is antithetical and hostile to orthodox Christianity, we should be on our guard. Most likely, many of our kids' schools and friends, TV and social media, are teaching them some things that are not compatible with faith in Christ. A good defense against the devil's lies begins in the home, where our children are most heavily influenced.

So, take out that Bible and Catechism and put them in a place where you can easily access them and remember to use them! Bring out a hymnal if you have one. And set apart a time each day for Christian devotion. Do whatever time works best for you. If you need any resources or advice, please ask me. During the school year, I get my kids up earlier than needed (which is not easy!) so that we can have time for devotion. And if we run out of time for the Catechism and Bible memory verse, I quiz them in the car ride to school. I also have the Small Catechism set to music which

I can play for them in the car wherever we go. Certainly, we all fail at times to make it work, but we repent knowing that we live in Christ's forgiveness and redouble our efforts.



FROM THE STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE . . .



At the end of the first of his chapters on the virtue of faith in *Mere Christianity*, C.S. Lewis provides a helpful reminder, by way of analogy, for the foundation of stewardship. He wrote:

"Every faculty you have, your power of thinking or of moving your limbs from moment to moment, is given you by God. If you devoted every moment of your whole life exclusively to His service you could not give Him anything that was not in a sense His own already. So then, when we talk of a man doing anything for God or giving anything to God, I will tell you what it is really like. It is like a small child going to its father and saying, 'Daddy, give me sixpence to buy you a birthday present.' Of course, the father does, and he is pleased with the child's present. It is all very nice and proper, but only an idiot would think that the father is sixpence to the good on the transaction. When a man has made these two discoveries God can really get to work. It is after this that real life begins. (128-129)."

This is the first thing we are given to confess about stewardship, and it has to do with ownership. God owns everything, and we are simply managers – stewards – acting on His behalf. This is true not only of all that we have in this life (Deut. 8:17-18) but also all that we are in this life (1 Cor. 6:20).

The rest flows from here. Since we are stewards, or managers, of what belongs to God, entrusted to make use of it according to His will, there is an expectation of responsibility and accountability. For the Lord said, "Everyone to whom much was given, of him much will be required, and from him to whom they entrusted much, they will demand the more" (Luke 12:48b). And from this comes blessing and reward: "Well done, good and faithful servant. You have been faithful over a little; I will set you over much. Enter into the joy of your master" (Matt. 25:21).

We have everything we need to support this body and life from our God's fatherly divine goodness and mercy, without any merit or worthiness in us. We have everything we need for our spiritual life also from His merciful hands. On account of the sacrifice of His Son, our Lord Jesus, through the preaching of the Gospel and the administration of the sacraments, we have the forgiveness of sins, eternal life, and everlasting salvation delivered to us with absolute certainty that it is ours – not as stewards but as sons (Gal. 4:1-7). Let us then, as His own sons, press all that He gives to us into the service of His church and to His glory.




Do you have a child or grandchild in 5th grade through middle school who has not been confirmed? Talk to Pastor about registering your child for class.




1. Say affirmations such as "I appreciate you."

5. Ask "if" questions like, "If you could be a superhero, what special powers would you have?"

9. Notice something important to them and comment on it.

I'd like to thank all of you for your generous contributions! Without your assistance, I would not have been able to purchase this wonderful Braille display. I feel very blessed to have all of you as a part of my life! God is awesome!

included is a photo of my Handy Tech Braille Star 80. This Braille display enables me to read text on the screen, using refreshable Braille. My previous Handy Tech display lasted 17 years, and it was used at least 40 hours a week!

I use this display not only to read and transcribe documents like the bulletin and the readings, but I also utilize it to browse the web, shop for items, and read articles, documents, and books. In addition, my Braille display is essential in my current occupations. I teach English as a second language to adults, many of whom work for Proctor and Gamble in Costa Rica. I also work as a web accessibility tester, which involves testing web sites and applications, while offering feedback and suggestions in order to make technology and the internet more usable for people who are blind. I've participated in usability studies for companies like Verizon, Federal Express, Walmart, and Google. I am so grateful for these opportunities!

Again, I'd like to let all of you know how thankful I am for your generosity!
